

NIH FUNDING AT WORK IN ARKANSAS



QUICK FACTS

NIH awarded **\$90.9 MILLION**¹ in grants and contracts during FY2021 that directly supported **1,841 JOBS**² and **\$256 MILLION**² economic activity in Arkansas.

The highest annual occurrences of disease deaths in Arkansas are due to **CANCER** (6,482 lives lost), **HEART DISEASE** (8,669 lives lost) and **STROKE** (1,561 lives lost).³
