QUICK FACTS

NIH awarded **\$785.7 MILLION**¹ in grants and contracts during FY2021 that directly supported **10,916 JOBS**² and **\$1.883 BILLION**² economic activity in Missouri.

The highest annual occurrences of disease deaths in Missouri are due to **CANCER** (12,873 lives lost), **HEART DISEASE** (15,018 lives lost) and **STROKE** (3,031 lives lost).³
