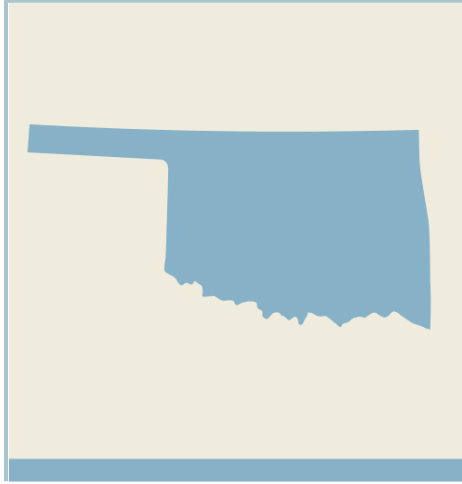


NIH FUNDING AT WORK IN OKLAHOMA



QUICK FACTS

NIH awarded **\$128.3 MILLION**¹ in grants and contracts during FY2021 that directly supported **2,927 JOBS**² and **\$403 MILLION**² economic activity in Oklahoma.

The highest annual occurrences of disease deaths in Oklahoma are due to **CANCER** (8,309 lives lost), **HEART DISEASE** (10,960 lives lost) and **STROKE** (1,803 lives lost).³
