

# NIH FUNDING AT WORK IN TEXAS



## QUICK FACTS

NIH awarded **\$1.64 BILLION**<sup>1</sup> in grants and contracts during FY2021 that directly supported **34,394 JOBS**<sup>2</sup> and **\$5.4 BILLION**<sup>2</sup> economic activity in Texas.

The highest annual occurrences of disease deaths in Texas are due to **CANCER** (41,489 lives lost), **HEART DISEASE** (46,139 lives lost) and **STROKE** (10,807 lives lost).<sup>3</sup>
