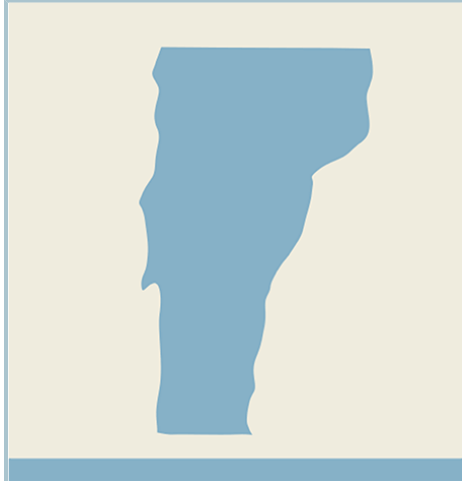


NIH FUNDING AT WORK IN VERMONT



QUICK FACTS

NIH awarded **\$66.4 MILLION**¹ in grants and contracts during FY2021 that directly supported **1,026 JOBS**² and **\$146 MILLION**² economic activity in Vermont.

The highest annual occurrences of disease deaths in Vermont are due to **CANCER** (1,378 lives lost), **HEART DISEASE** (1,368 lives lost) and **STROKE** (269 lives lost).³
